The Departmental Honors Scholar degree designation is awarded through the University Honors Program at Wright State University. For your convenience, this template reflects typical departmental honors requirements, and you may find that this template will help you to convert the existing quarter requirements to semester requirements.

Semester Requirements
Cumulative and major GPA of at least 3.0 and junior
status.
Departmental Application (please see attached),
summary proposal (~200 words) for a Senior Thesis
Research project, endorsement of the student's
departmental advisor, Senior Thesis advisor, and EES
Undergraduate Studies Committee.
In consultation with a faculty research advisor, students
design a research problem that involves data collection
and analysis. Students must satisfactorily complete a
Senior Thesis that requires between 4 – 6 credits in EES
4960. The final Senior Thesis will normally exceed
fifteen pages and be more than 2500 words. More than
one draft will be required.
Evaluation will include periodic assessment of progress
and a final determination of the quality of the research
primarily through the written thesis. This evaluation will
be made by the student's Senior Thesis advisor.
The student's Senior Thesis advisor will consist of a
single faculty member.
The typical timeline for a Senior Thesis project will be:
(1) application at least two semesters prior to the
student's expected date of graduation; (2) data collection
and analysis during one semester; and (3) writing,
revision, and final reporting during a second semester.

Students beginning a Senior Thesis during the quarter
system will register for credit as EES 496. Satisfactory
credits earned in EES 496 will apply by a factor of 2/3 to the 4 – 6 credits in EES 4960 required for a Senior
Thesis under the semester system.

Students may graduate with Departmental Honors by completing the following requirements. If you have questions about any of these requirements, please see your academic advisor. For university honors information, please visit www.wright.edu/academics/honors.

Departmental Honors Scholar

Students who have a cumulative GPA of 3.0 or better may apply during their junior year for admission to the EES Department Honors Program. For Departmental Honors, students must: (1) apply to the Departmental Honors Program; and (2) notify the University Honors Program by visiting www.wright.edu/honors, clicking on the "Apply" link, and completing the on-line form.

Requirements for Departmental Honors:

- Students must have a cumulative GPA of at least a 3.0
- Students must have satisfactorily completed a Senior Thesis. The Senior Thesis requires a total of between 4 6 credits in EES 4960.
- Students must apply to the EES Department AND to the University Honors Program for Departmental Honors

To Apply to the EES Department for Departmental Honors....Applications to the EES Department Honors Program should be made in writing to the Undergraduate Studies Committee Chair and must include the following:

- A departmental application
- A summary proposal (of about 200 words) for a Senior Thesis research project
- The endorsement of the student's departmental academic advisor and that of the Senior Thesis Advisor, if not the same individual.

Please note that your expected date of graduation must be at least 2 full semesters, not including summer, after the date of the application.

To Apply to Graduate with Departmental Honors... <u>Applications to graduate with Departmental</u> Honors must be through the University Honors Program:

Complete the university application for departmental honors prior to applying for graduation. Applications are available online at www.wright.edu/academics/honors -- click on the "Forms" icon, then click on "Honors Degree Application." For Departmental Honors only, students also complete the personal data on the "Fulfillment of Departmental Honors Requirements" form and obtain signatures from the faculty advisor and department chair.
