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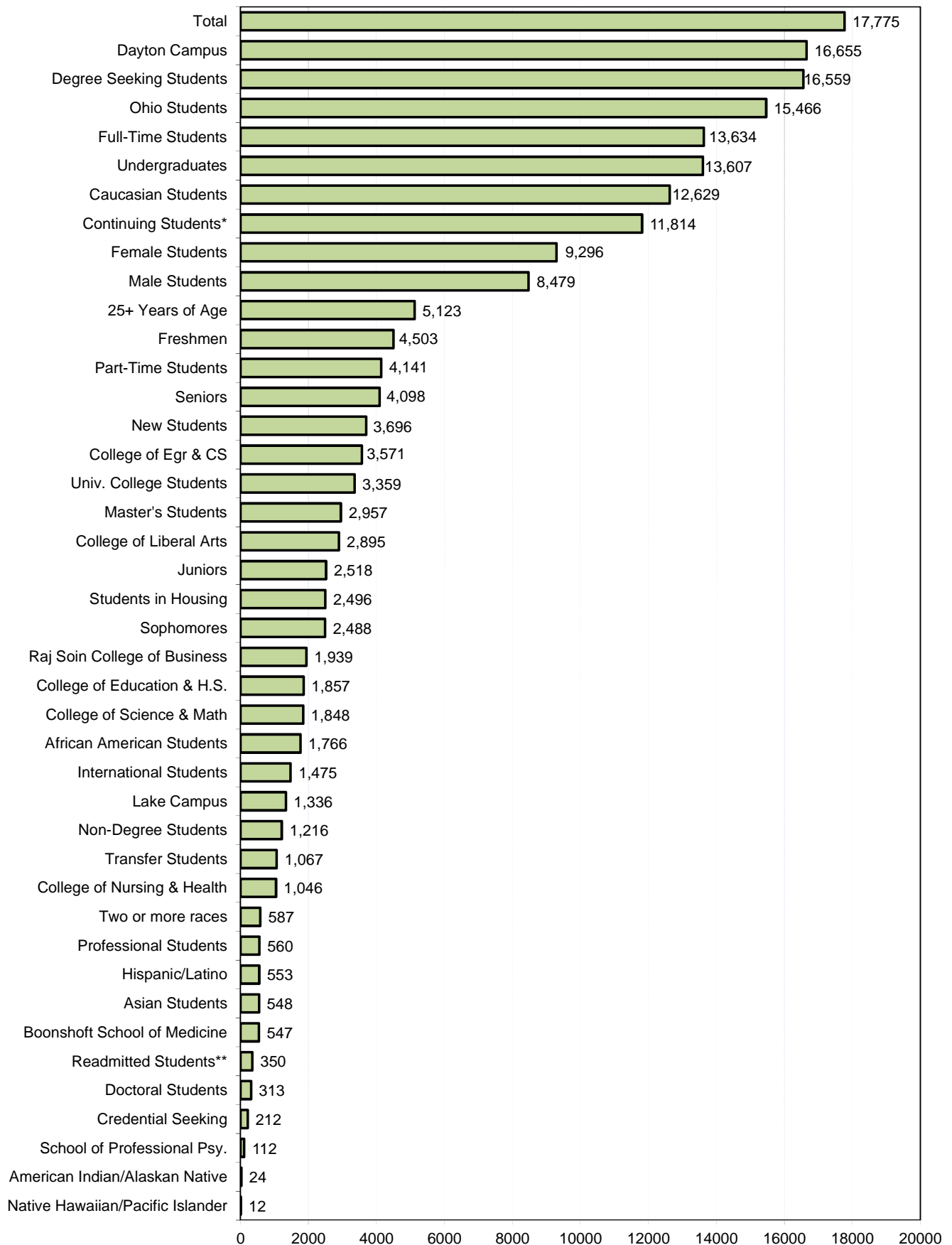
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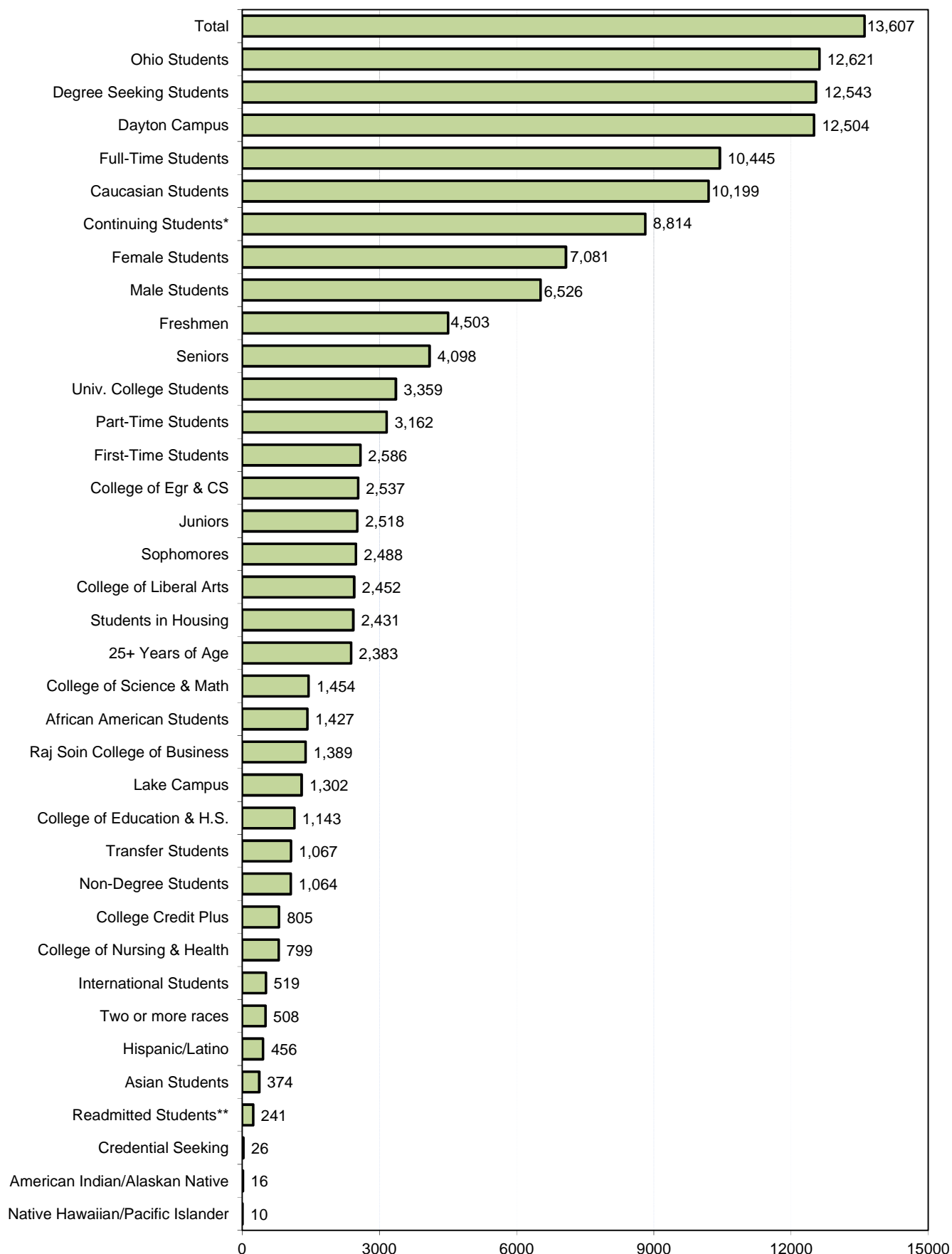
## Student Populations All Students

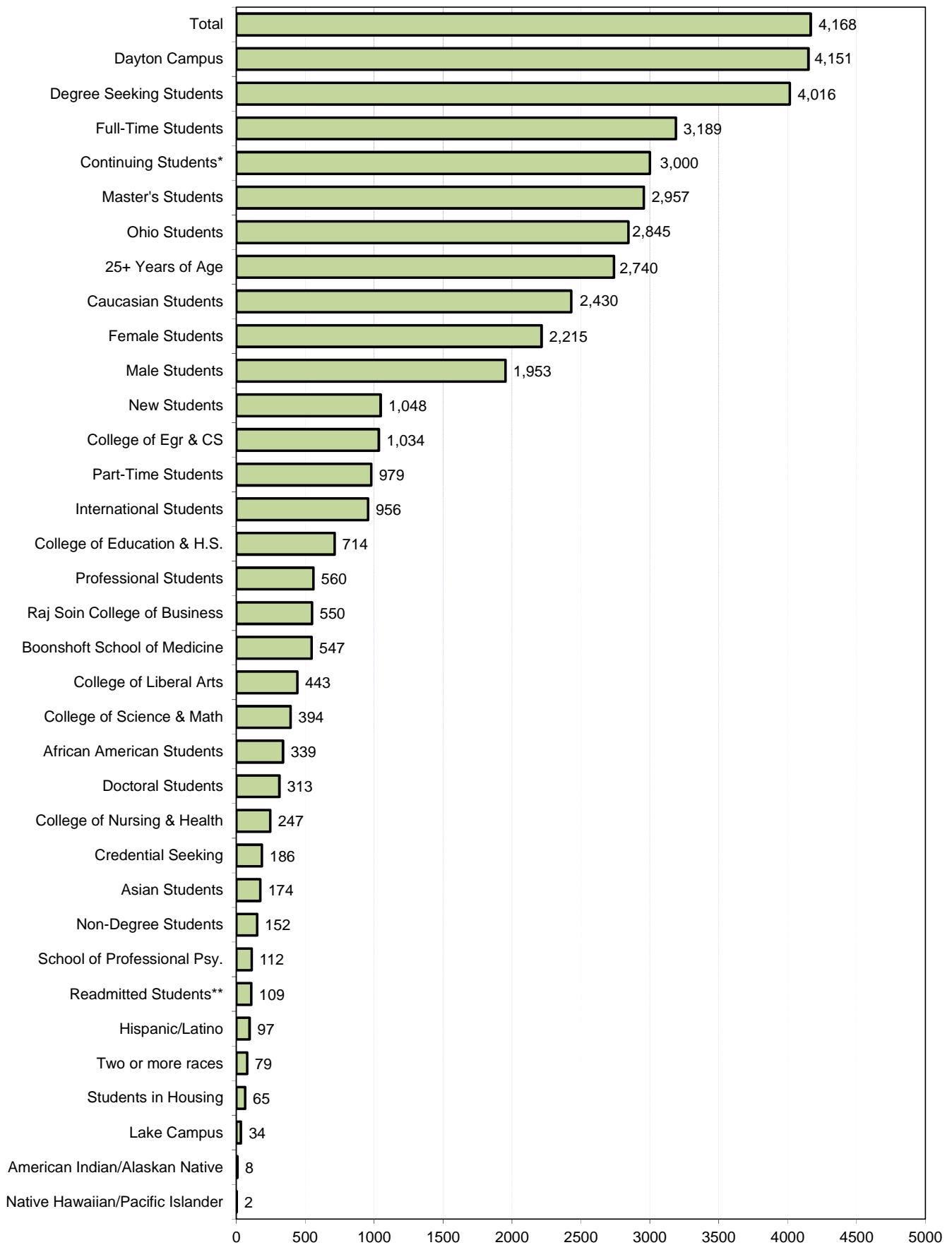
## Student Populations Undergraduate Students

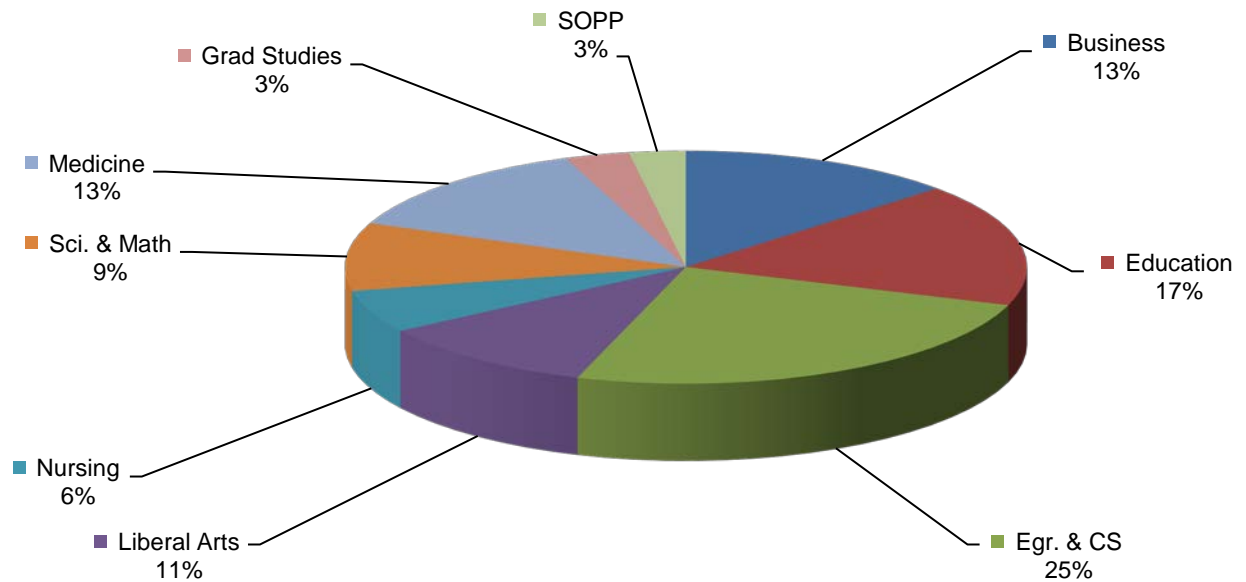

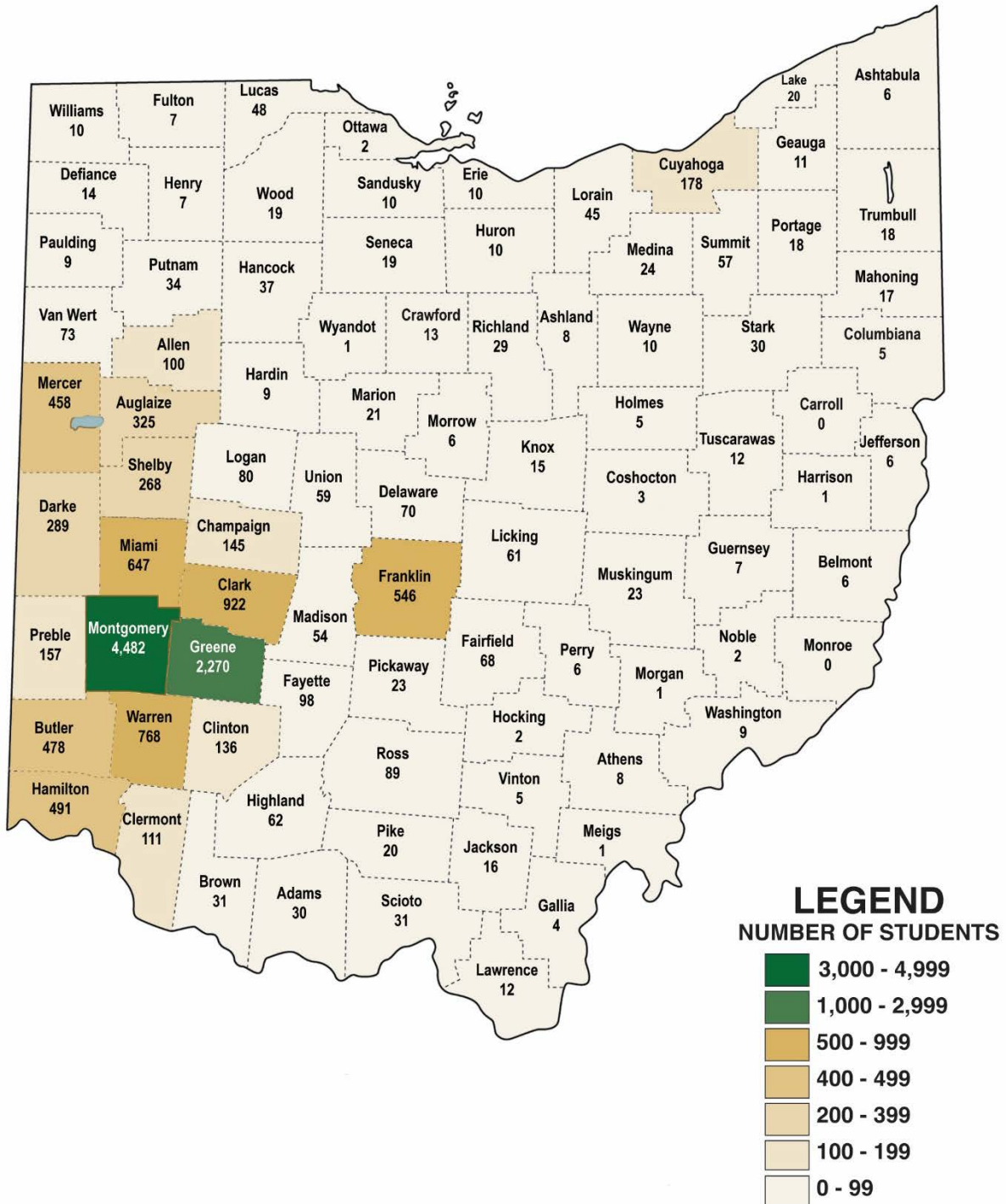

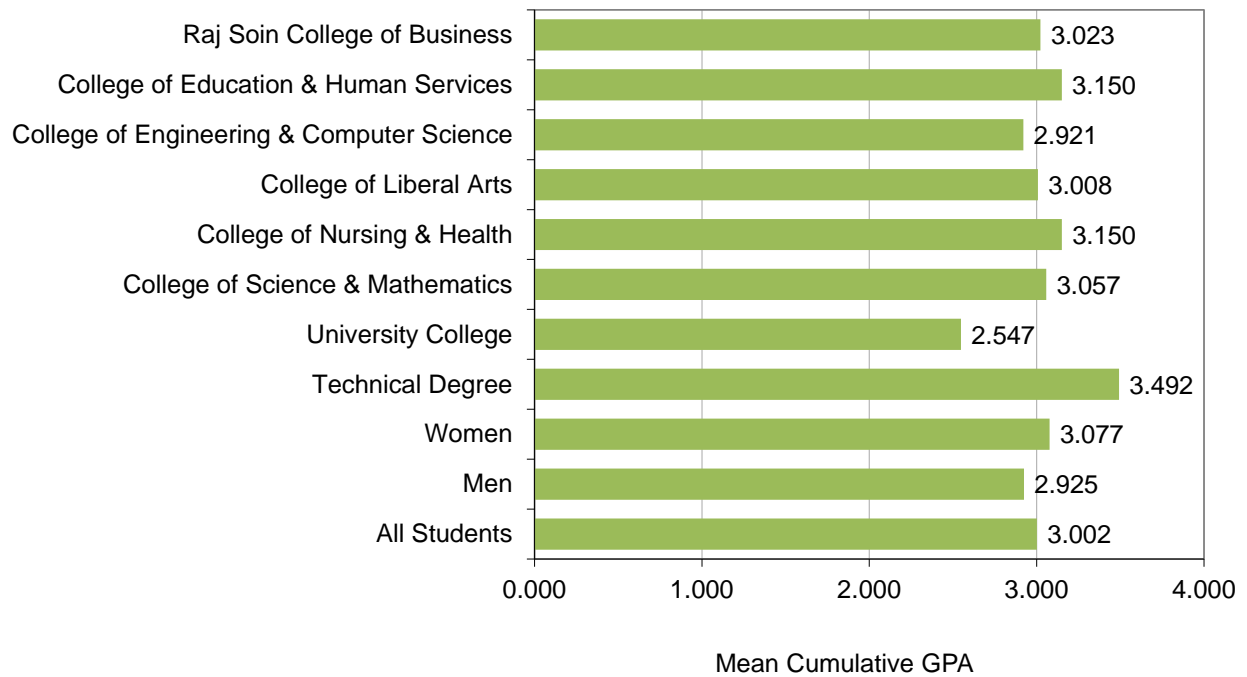

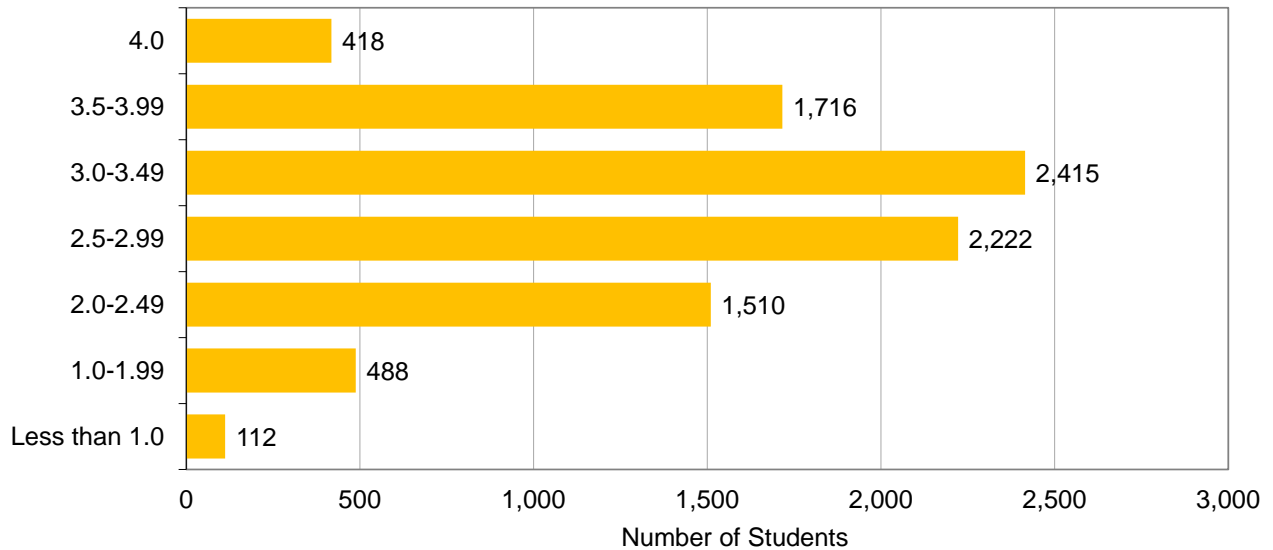

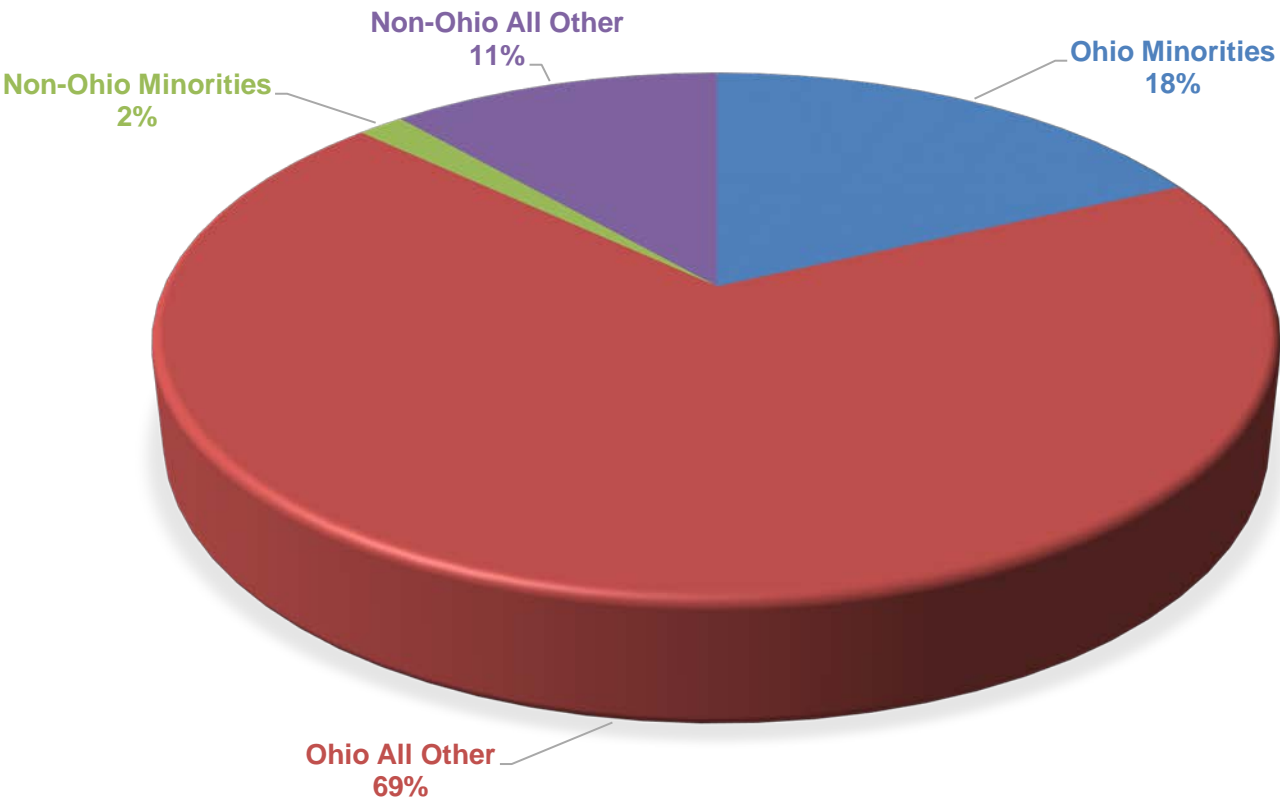

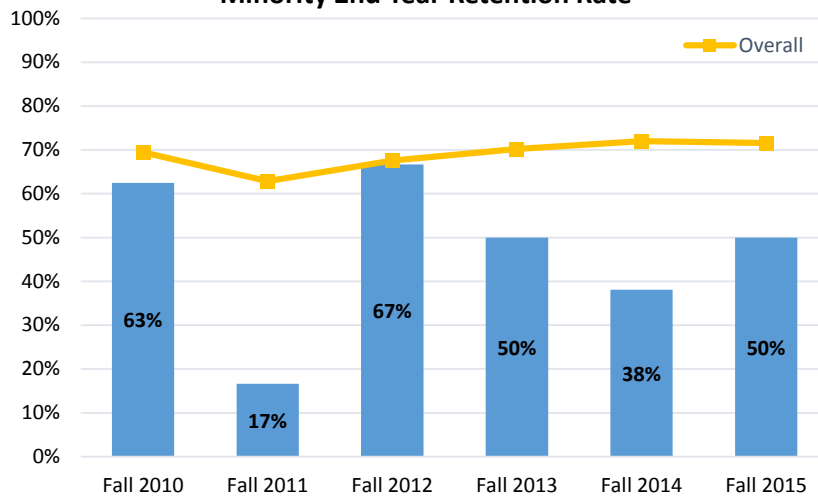
**Overall 2nd Year Retention Rate**



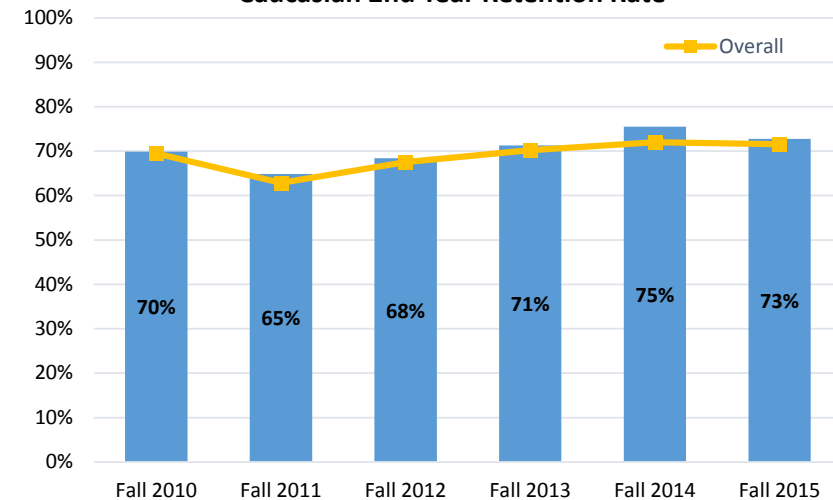
**Gender 2nd Year Retention Rate**

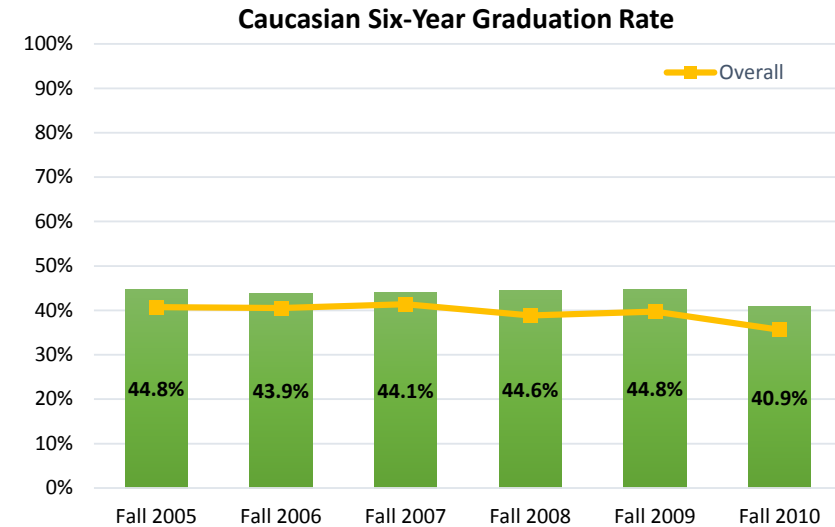
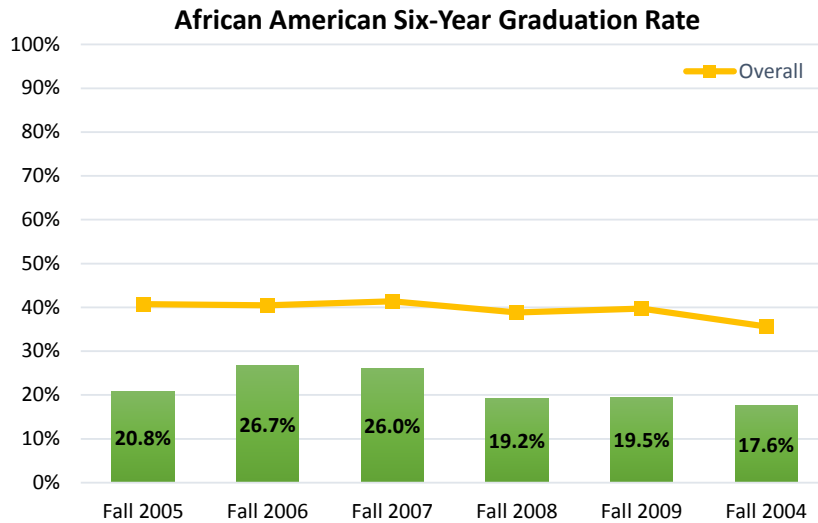
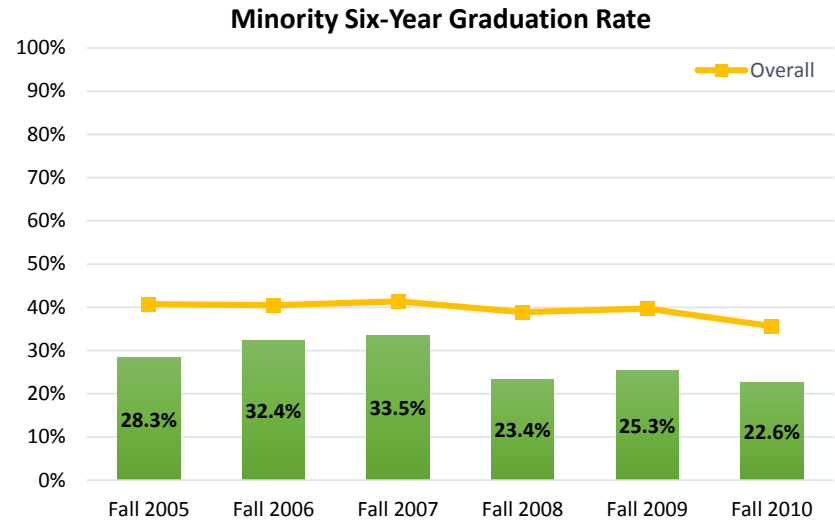
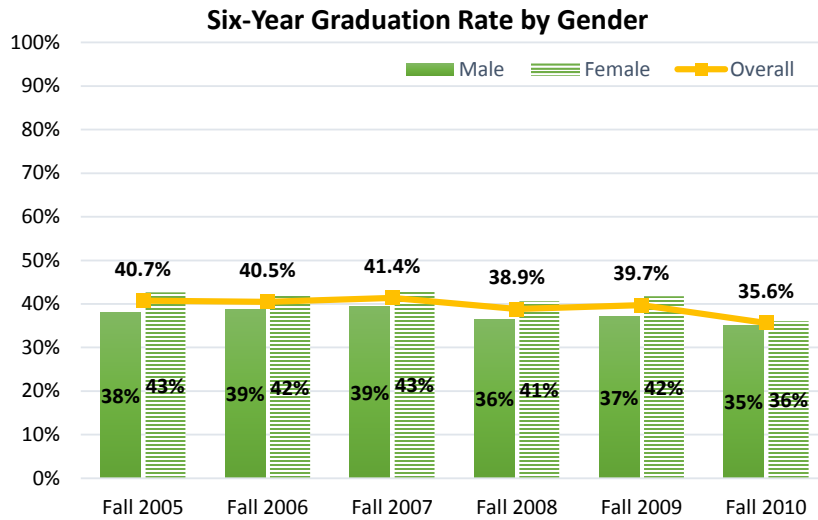


**Caucasian 2nd Year Retention Rate**



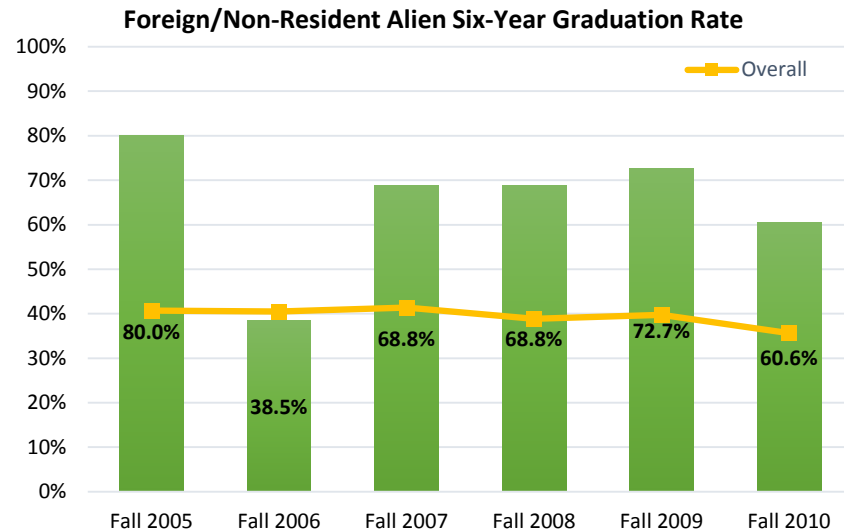
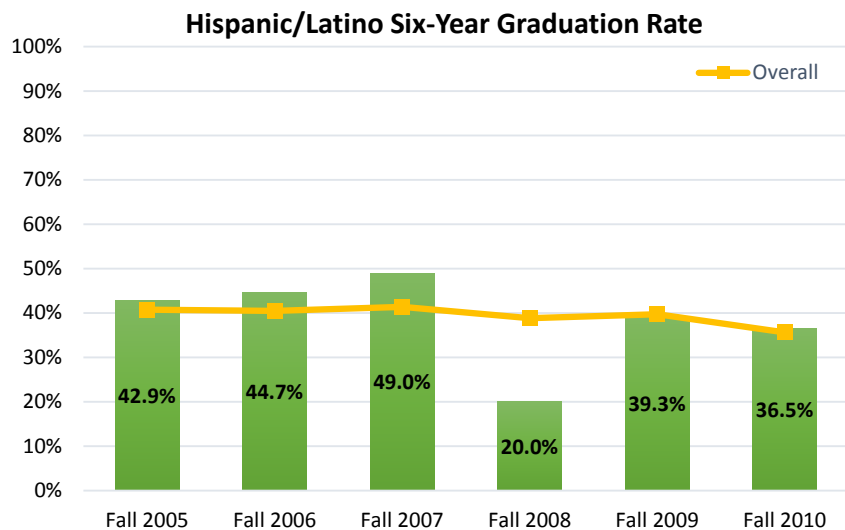
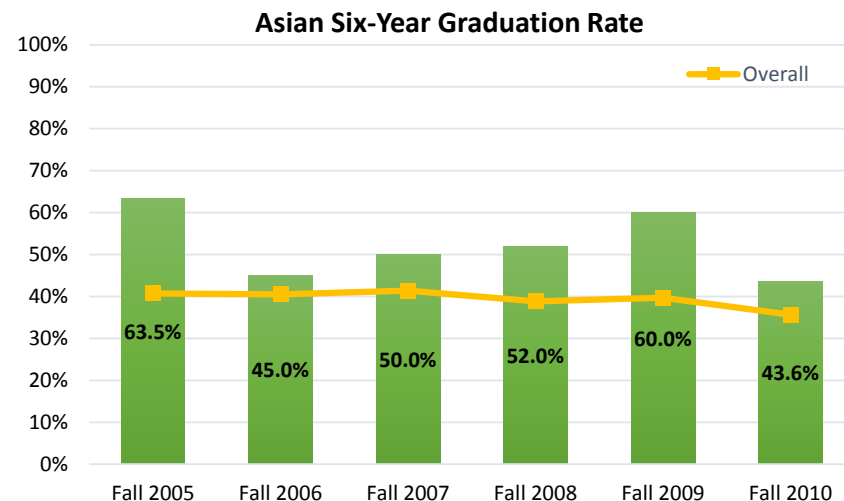
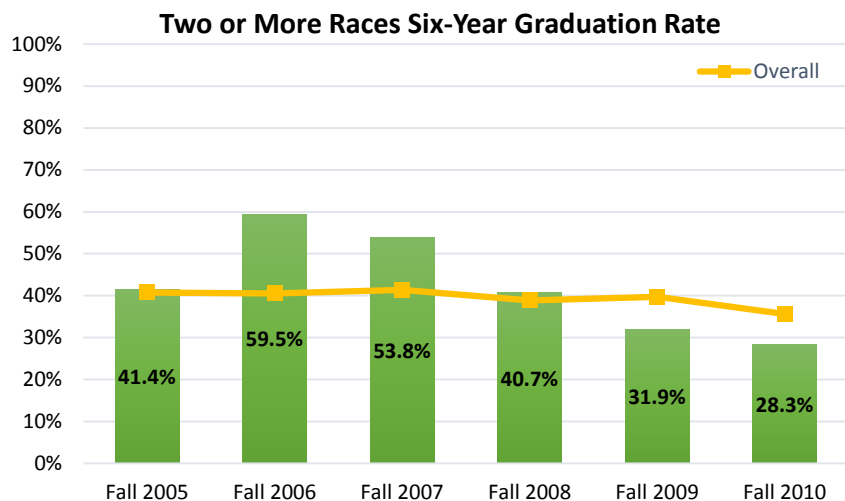

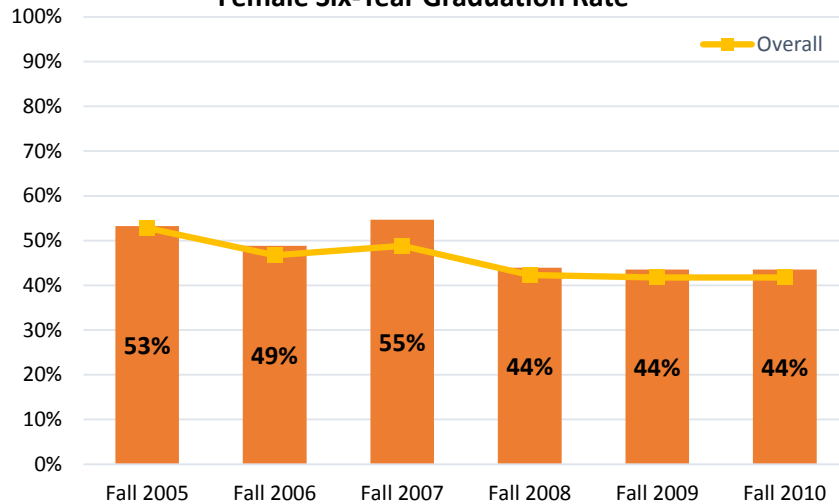
**Overall Six-Year Graduation Rate**



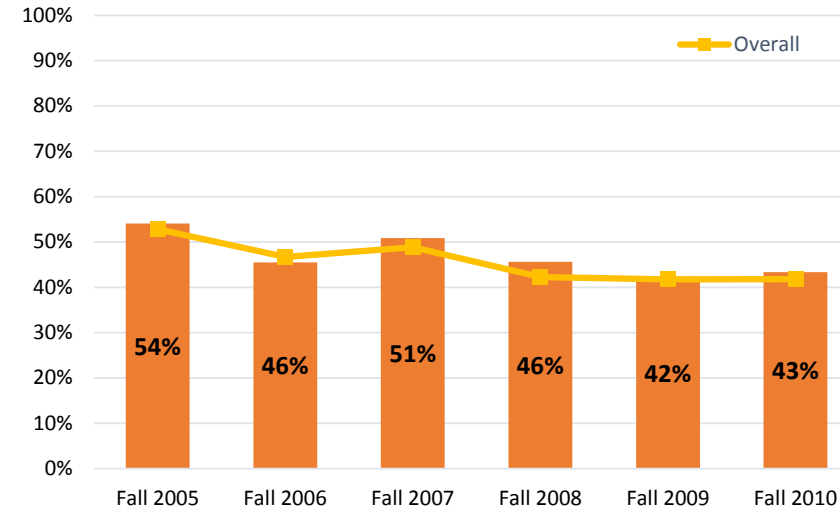
**Male Six-Year Graduation Rate**

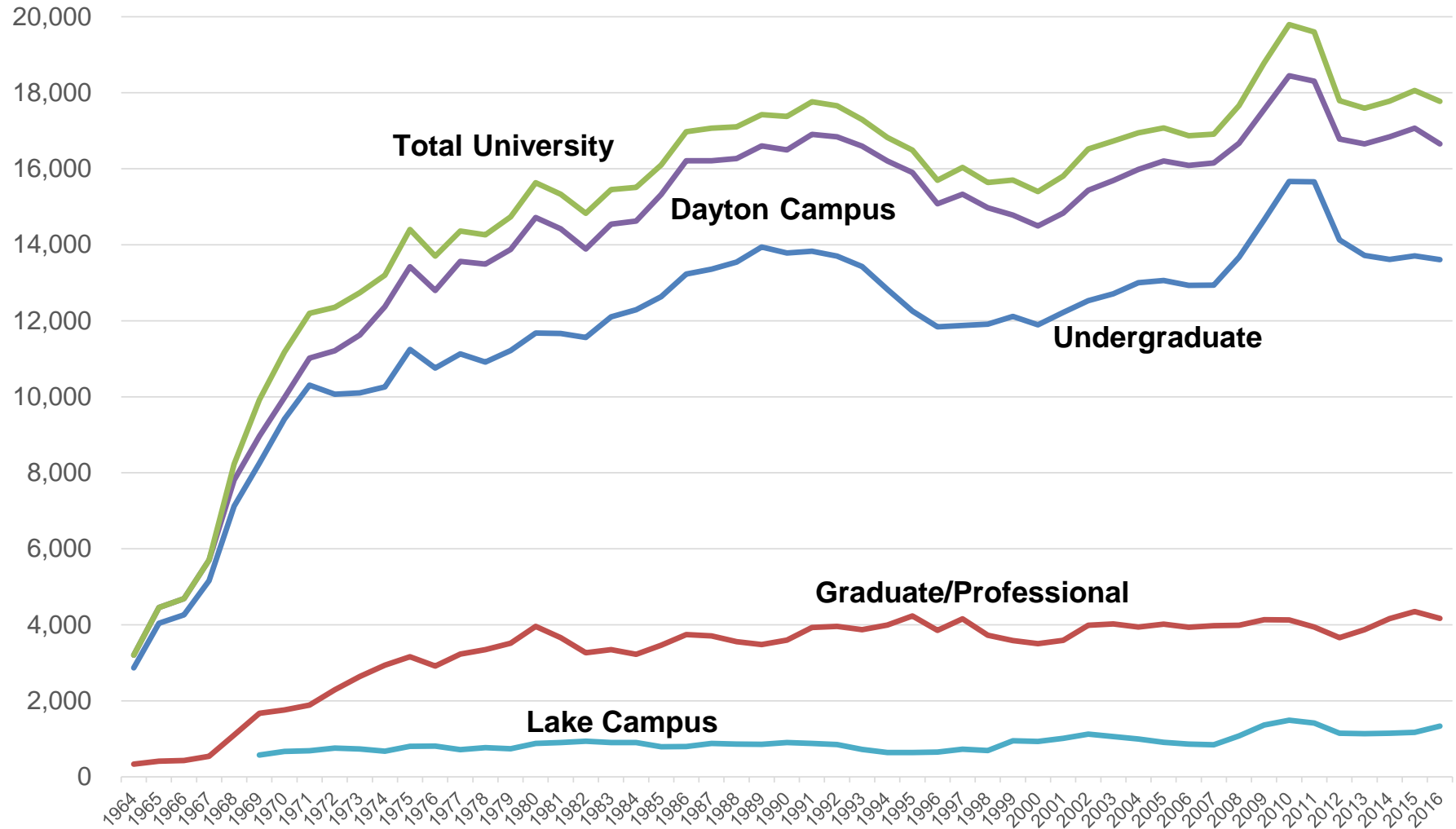

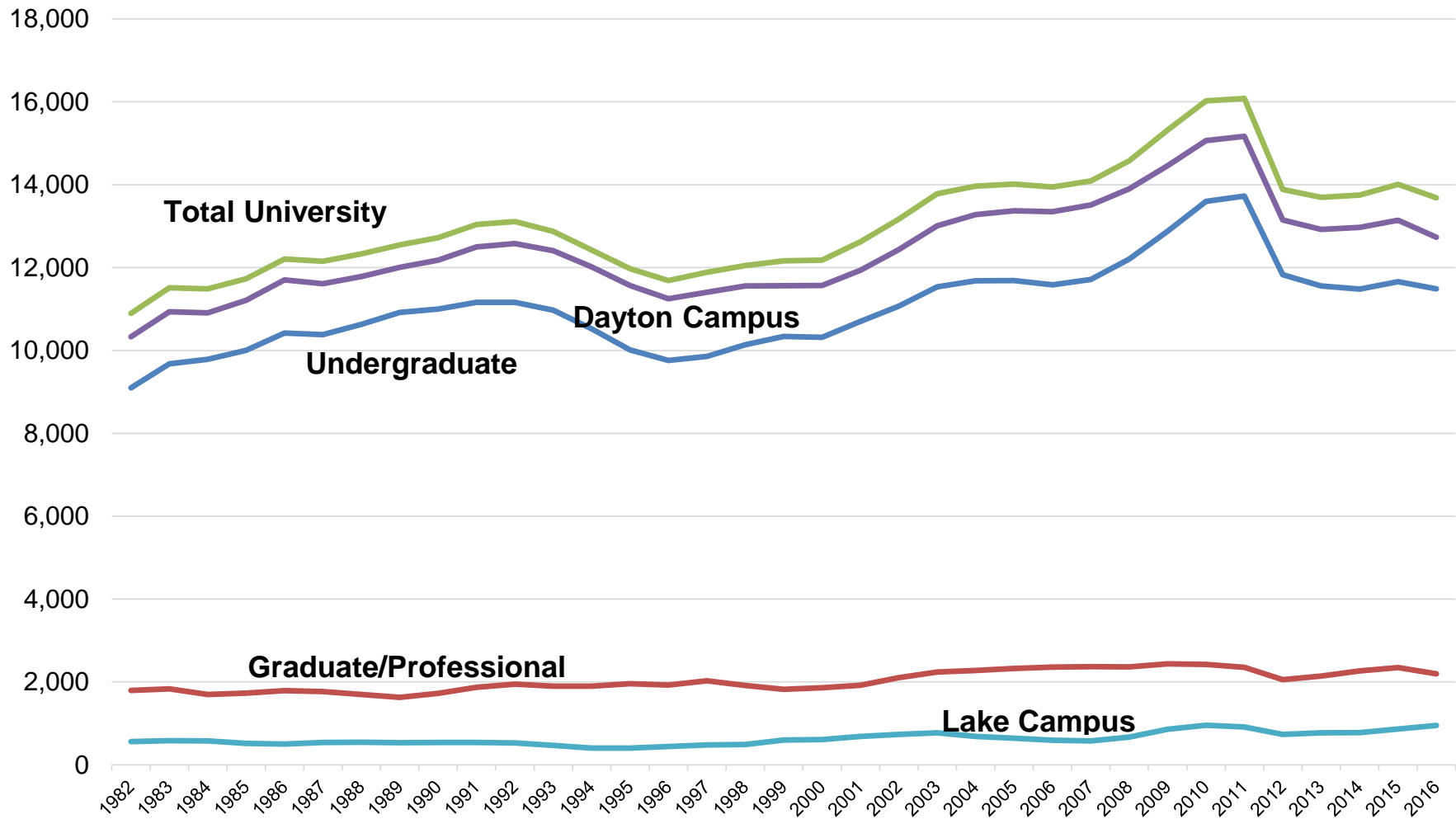

## Fall Term Full-Time Equivalents 1982 - 2016



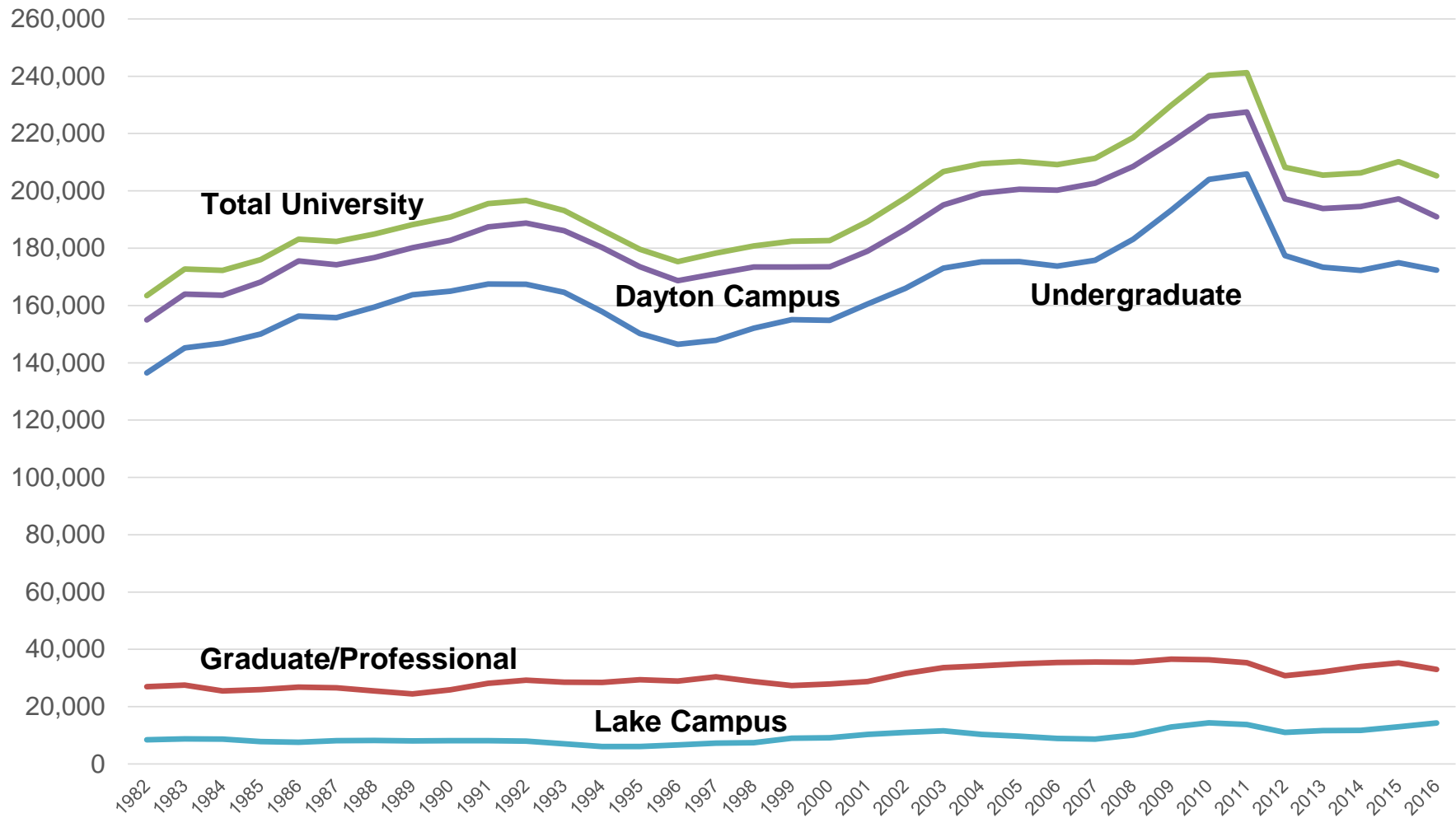

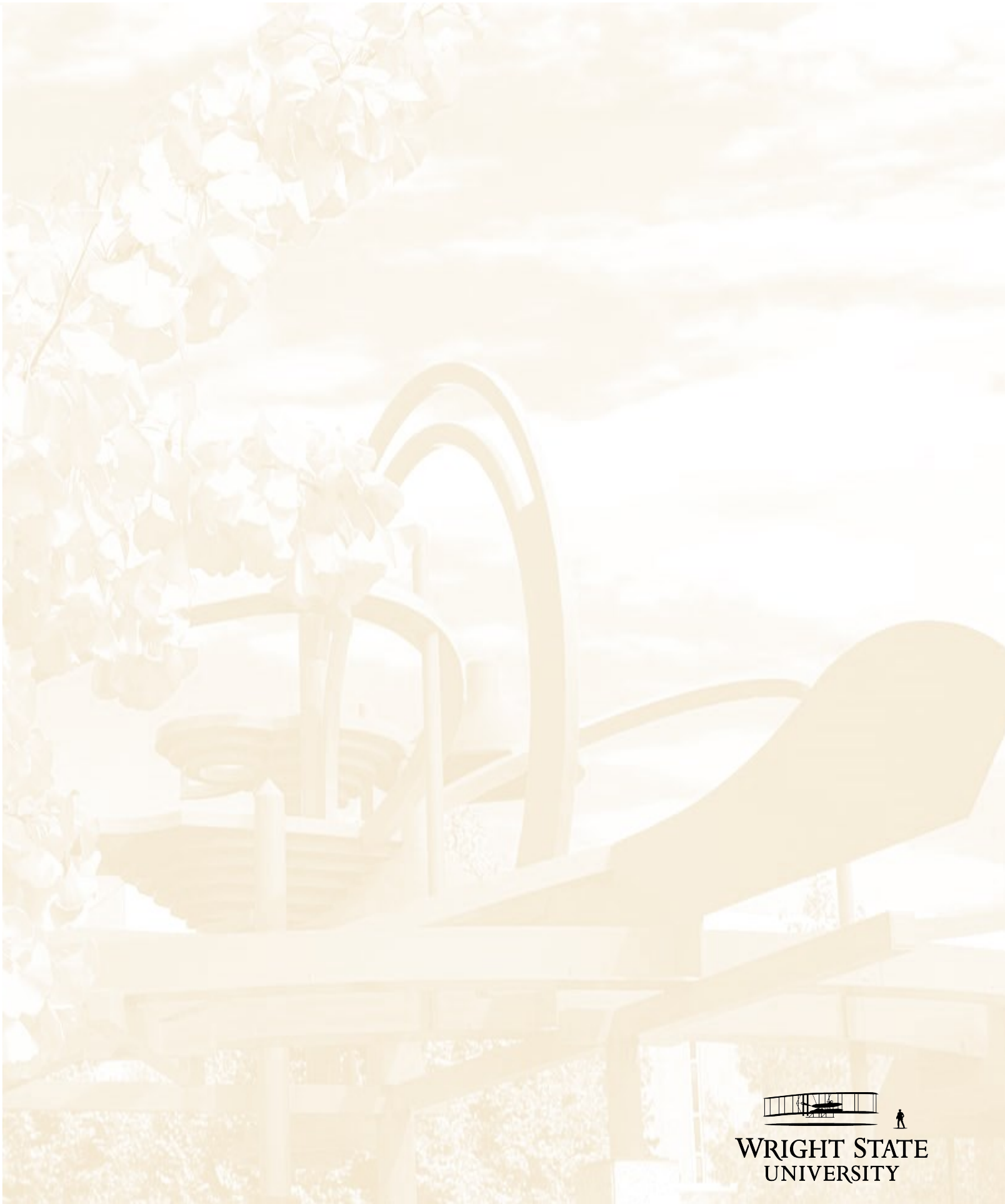
