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| <p>Eligibility Requirements</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Cumulative and/or major GPAs • Earned credit hours | <p>Junior or Senior students, who have maintained a 3.0 cumulative average, a 3.0 cumulative in department content courses, and are enrolled in the College of Education and Human Services, may apply for the Honors Program in Rehabilitation Services. Transfer students are required to maintain a 3.0 cumulative average for the first 30 credit hours of work at Wright State University. Under unusual conditions, transfer students may petition the Honors Committee for admissions to the Honors Program in Rehabilitation Services before 30 credit hours of work have been completed.</p> |
| <p>Proposal and Approval Process</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Requirements for a student proposal • Details about the department's approval of the proposal | <p>The honors project may deal with any topic or problem related to rehabilitation services. The project may take on the character of library research, fieldwork, development of curriculum materials, study of classroom strategies, or any facet of the general area in which the student is interested. The students are encouraged to do interdisciplinary work involving two or more program areas within the College of Education and Human Services or the assistance of another department within the university.</p> <p>The student must submit an outline of honors project proposal to the advisor and the department chair for approval.</p> |
| <p>Academic Requirements</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Length, scope, and nature of the research/project/internship/co-op/performance • Course(s), credit hours (typically 3-6 semester hours), and required grades • Presentation (if required) | <p>The student will enroll for two successive semesters in RHB 3700, for a total of six hours. If the nature of the projects is such that it requires more than two academic semesters for work, the student, with the approval of the honors advisor and the honors coordinator, may enroll in this course for an additional three credit hours.</p> <p>Optional presentation for the final semester of RHB 3700.</p> |
| <p>Evaluation</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Describe the criterion • List who will determine satisfactory completion of the departmental honors requirements | <p>At the time of graduation, the student must present:</p> <p>An overall cumulative average of 3.0. A cumulative average of 3.0 in professional content courses. An honors project evaluated with a grade of "A".</p> <p>The Department Chair and the Advisor will determine if the student has met the criteria for completion of the Honors project.</p> |
| <p>Project Oversight</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Detail who will serve as a student's project advisor (a single faculty | <p>A Department of Human Services faculty member will serve as the honors project advisor.</p> |

| <p>Timeline</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Describe the typical timeline for completion of the project, including milestones for when a student should apply to, begin work on, and complete the project | <p>Students must contact the proposed honors advisor the semester prior to the anticipated project. The student will work on the honors project for a time frame of two semesters.</p> |
| <p>Q2S Transition Plan</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • If a student begins an honors project on the quarter system but will complete the project on the semester system, describe the transition plan, including Q2S course equivalencies | <p>Students will transition honors projects to semesters using RHB 3700. The project will continue through the transition and will be assessed at the end of the completion of the honors project.</p> |
