



5) TAX FACTS

TAX FORMS - Special Case for Some

Even if you were in the U.S. only one day in 2011 (and despite the fact you maybe did not earn any income during 2011), YOU WILL STILL BE REQUIRED BY FEDERAL TAX LAWS TO FILE THE IRS FORM 8843 THIS SPRING.



*** Filing Form 8843 does not mean you owe the government money but rather to explain the basis of your claim that you can exclude days of presence in the United States for purposes of the substantial presence test. If you did not work or earn income in 2011, this will be the only form for you to file. It is a very simple form and it is due by June 15, 2011. If you do not file Form 8843 on time, you could be considered a U.S. resident under the substantial presence test and this is one of the penalties.

If you didn't earn any income in 2011, You DO NOT need to purchase FNTR password to fill 8843. In mid-March through this newsletter, we will provide you instructions on how to complete the Form 8843.
