1. ADMISSIONS AND DEADLINES

Transfer to Wright State University

Students must earn a minimum 2.0 GPA from Northwest State in order to transfer to Wright State.

Wright State processes applications as they are received. To help you make a smooth and timely transition, we recommend you submit your application by the following dates:

Fall Semester:	April 1
Spring Semester:	October 15
Summer Semester:	February 1

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Students must apply for undergraduate admission one semester prior to completing their studies at Northwest State.

In order to be admitted fully as a bachelor of technical and applied studies major at Wright State, students will need to achieve a cumulative GPA of a 2.0, as well as complete FAS 2030, 2040, and 2100. In addition, students must earn a C or higher in ENG 111 at Northwest State and three courses from Wright State Core.


