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- In order to be admitted fully as a social science education major at Wright State, students will need to achieve a cumulative GPA of a 2.5.
 - Students are required to begin their Wright State program in fall term of the junior year/year three.
 - Students must apply for admission to Wright State **and** the Social Science Education program by January 15 of the sophomore year/year two (while still studying at Sinclair). Additionally, students must apply for field experience, ED 2650 Field Experience I at Wright State, by January 15 of sophomore year/year two.
- *Note that students must apply and be admitted to the university before Social Science Program and field applications can be approved.
- In addition to submitting the program application, the following criteria are required for full admission into the Adolescence to Young Adult Licensure program:
 - Cumulative minimum GPA of 2.6
 - Grade of C or higher in each of the following:
 - All Teacher Education courses:
 - Sinclair: EDU 1100 and EDU 1105
 - Wright State: ED 2700 and ED 2800
 - Any equivalent transfer courses and Wright State courses in the content areas
 - Passing scores in each of the following areas:
 - One of the following reading scores:
 - ACT reading score of 19 or better
 - SAT evidence-based reading and writing score of 520 or better
 - ETS praxis core academic skills for educators reading score of 162 or better
 - One of the following writing scores:
 - ACT writing score of 6 or better
 - SAT writing dimension score of 5 or better
 - ETS praxis core academic skills for educators writing score of 165 or better
 - One of the following math scores:
 - ACT math score of 17 or better
 - SAT math score of 510 or better
 - ETS praxis core academic skills for educators math score of 158 or better
 - Consult with your dedicated Wright State academic advisor about the program application process and deadlines.
 - 126-131 hours minimum are required for a BA degree in Social Science Education with Adolescence to Young Adult Licensure at Wright State.

Students interested in applying to the Wright Path must submit a request for membership at wright.edu/sinclair.

High school students must be close to graduating before applying to the Wright Path, and current Sinclair College students must have a minimum 2.0 GPA.

Transfer to Wright State University

Students must earn a minimum 2.0 GPA from Sinclair College in order to transfer to Wright State. To be admitted into the Social Science Education Program at Wright State, students must earn a minimum 2.5 GPA from Sinclair College.

Students are required to begin their Wright State program in fall term of the junior year/year three.

Students must apply for admission to Wright State and the Social Science Education program by January 15 of the sophomore year/year two (while still studying at Sinclair). Additionally, students must apply for field experience, ED 2650 Field Experience I at Wright State, by January 15 of sophomore year/year two.
