

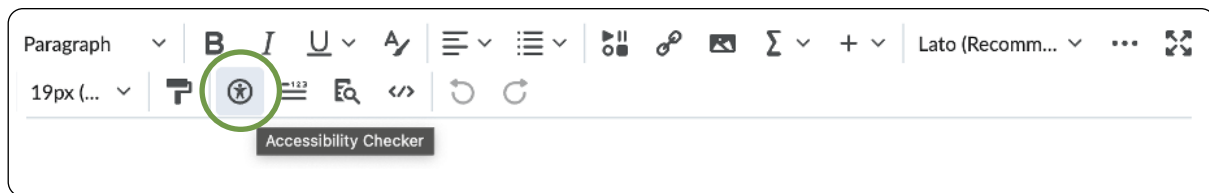
Pilot/D2L Accessibility Checker

Pilot's Built-In Accessibility Checker

The Accessibility Checker in Pilot helps identify common accessibility issues and will offer the option to fix them directly within the editor. It's designed to improve the experience for all students, including those using screen readers or assistive technology.

Where Can You Find It?

While viewing the HTML Editor in Pilot, the Accessibility Checker can be found on the second row of the toolbar above the text editor.

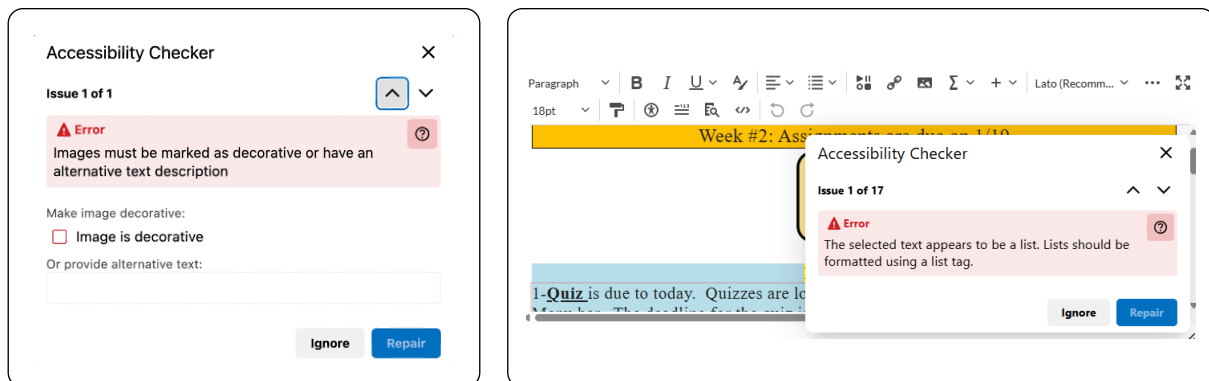


Note: You may need to expand the toolbar by selecting the ellipses (...) icon to reveal it.

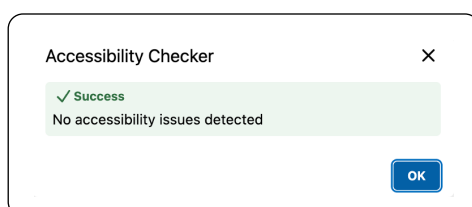
Fix Errors Before Publishing

If the Accessibility Checker encounters elements that are non-compliant, a highlighted error message will appear along with guidance on how to correct the issue.

If the Checker identifies multiple issues, it will list them in order, with the option to navigate through the issues with the up and down arrows.



Examples above show two error displays; one for missing ALT text, and the other improper list formatting.



If no issues are found, a "Success" message will show. You're ready to publish!
