Wright State University provides an opportunity for Ohio high school students to enroll in university courses for high school and/or college credit. Please read this information carefully before submitting an application.

Enrollment Options

Students <u>must</u> indicate under which option they wish to enroll. *If a preferred option is not indicated, the application will be considered incomplete.* **NOTE: A student may not change options during the academic year.**

OPTION A—allows the student to choose, upon enrollment, college credit or both high school and college credit. Under Option A, the student is responsible for tuition, books, and fees.

OPTION B—allows the student to receive both high school and college credit. Under this option, tuition, fees, and required books are covered at public expense.

Program Guidelines

- Students interested in participating in PSEO at Wright State must submit an application for admission into the program. The deadlines for applications are: Fall Semester—May 1; Spring Semester—November 1.
- Students who wish to continue their participation in PSEO must re-apply each year, by the deadline.
- Students must complete university placement testing in mathematics and English **only** if they are admitted into the PSEO program. Additional information on placement testing will be included with the student's notification of admission into the PSEO program.
- Admission to the PSEO program does not guarantee that a student will be able to enroll in a given course or any course since the
 university has a primary obligation to first serve the needs of the university's degree-seeking students.
- Students at the Dayton Campus are permitted to enroll in *two courses per semester*, based on the number of credit hours they are eligible to complete. Students at the Lake Campus are permitted to enroll in *up to 10 credit hours per semester*, based on the number of credit hours they are eligible to complete.
- Students are responsible for consulting with their high school counselor to determine if and how courses completed through the PSEO program will be given credit towards high school graduation requirements.
- Both admitted students and their parents must attend a PSEO orientation session prior to registering for courses.

Application Procedures

- 1. Complete sections I and III of the application form.
- 2. Ask your parent/guardian to complete section IV of the application form.
- 3. Ask your school counselor to complete section II of the application form.
- 4. Ask your principal to complete section V of the application form.
- 5. Submit your completed application, an *official copy of your high school transcript*, **a \$10 application fee** (not required for students re-applying to the program), and any other required documents as indicated by the eligibility criteria. Make check payable to Wright State University. The fee is nonrefundable.
- 6. All application materials must be received and complete by the stated deadline (postmarks are not acceptable) for an application to be considered.
- 7. Keep a copy of all application materials for your records.
- 8. Students will receive written notification of their admission status and additional program information by June 15 for fall semester applicants, and November 15 for spring applicants.

Eligibility

Seniors

- 1. Completed junior year of high school and at least 13 college preparatory courses
- 2. Earned a 3.25 or better cumulative grade point average
- 3. Passed all parts of the Ohio Graduation Test required for high school graduation

Juniors

- 1. Completed sophomore year of high school and at least nine college preparatory courses
- 2. Earned a 3.5 or better cumulative grade point average


Sophomores

- 1. Completed freshman year of high school and at least four college preparatory courses
- 2. Earned a 3.75 or better cumulative grade point average
- 3. Completed the ACT with a composite score of at least 26 or the SAT with a combined math and critical reading score of 1190

Freshmen

- 1. Completed the eighth grade
- 2. Completed the ACT with a composite score of at least 26 or the SAT with a combined math and critical reading score of 1190
- 3. Students who will be **high school freshmen** must submit a letter of recommendation from a teacher, school counselor, or school administrator which addresses the student's academic abilities and needs

SECTION IV: TO BE COMPLETED BY THE PARENT OR GUARDIAN

The high school has counseled me regarding the consequences of participation in this program, and my son/daughter has my approval to apply for admission and enroll at Wright State University as a Post Secondary Enrollment Option student. The university has my consent to notify the school district and the state superintendent of public instruction of my son/daughter's enrollment and grades in classes at Wright State University. I understand under this program that:

- all PSEO students are required to complete a PSEO orientation before they will be able to register for courses. Failure to attend an orientation will result in the student being ineligible to take courses at Wright State through the PSEO program. I understand that there are no exceptions to this policy.
- high school students so enrolled will be treated as university-level students, and the expectations projected in the classes will be those normally expected of university students.
- high school students will constitute a minority in any given class.
- little or no effort will be extended to assure that a student is staying abreast of course requirements.
- university classes tend to be graded on a very small number of examinations, perhaps only a midterm and a final exam, and sometimes require extensive term papers or similar assignments.
- high school students taking courses through PSEO must maintain a 2.5 GPA and receive a grade of "C" or better in Wright State courses in order to maintain good academic standing. With the exception of academic good standing, high school students will be subject to the same policies as exist for all other students of Wright State University.
- high school students so enrolled will be held to the same standard of behavior as university students and are subject to the same disciplinary procedures as university students.
- in the event of a medical emergency, Wright State University personnel are authorized to obtain medical treatment as required.
