

SEI forward view and positioning: Equities

Monthly Commentary


 Equity markets across the globe rebounded in October as investor fears recessed on signals that several central banks would increase accommodative measures to spur economic growth; all primary markets were positive with Japan and U.S. large caps leading the charge. Within the U.S., commodity-related sectors (materials and energy) provided market leadership while more defensive names (utilities and consumer staples) lagged the broader market during the month's rally.

Forward View

- Though short-term volatility may continue, our view is that continued thematic improvements in many key developed regions will help offset near-term concerns of economic growth coming out of China.
- The backdrop remains accommodative across a variety of regions, both developed and emerging, supporting the case for fundamentals to lead equities modestly higher from current levels.
- Earnings expectations remain supportive. In the U.S., we believe
 prices can rise on underlying profitability, particularly in areas led by
 the consumer. International prospects now hold the element of upside
 surprise.

Positioning

- We believe strategic exposures across global equities, both developed and emerging, maintain an important role in a diversified portfolio.
- Further, we continue to focus on pockets of relative strength in areas like Japan and Europe as sources of return going forward, as both remain well positioned for potential upside surprise.
- Managers are leaning into their high conviction names and continue to hold a slight pro-cyclical bias on expectations of the recent selloff being short-term in nature.

Monthly Commentary


 Within fixed income, spread sectors provided positive performance as investor concerns about global growth eased and risk appetite increased. Emerging markets debt and U.S. high yield benefitted the most during the period as we saw spreads narrow from the risk-on environment. Additionally, interest rates rose during the period, causing U.S. Treasuries to move lower, after the Fed indicated that the possibility of a December liftoff remains.

Forward View


- We believe interest rates could remain range-bound in the near term though net movement will trend higher.
- When the Fed raises short-term interest rates, we expect the yield curve to flatten; although, short-term interest rate volatility could persist as the specific timing of these moves keep investors on edge.
- Spread widening across the spectrum, specifically within investment grade credits and high yield, has created an opportunity for active management moving into perceived oversold markets.

Positioning

- Remaining strategically diversified across fixed income markets is suggested.
- In key areas across our core strategies, we have begun to take advantage of spread widening within corporate credits.
- We are maintaining a modest curve-flattening bias within our core strategies in anticipation of shorter-term yields rising faster than longer-term yields.



U.S. Treasury Yield Curve









Hist Blend: SEI Dynamic Asset Allocation Fund: From the period 7/1/2010 through 4/30/2012, the SEI Dynamic Asset Allocation Fund index was comprised of 50% Barclays US 10-Year Treasury Futures Index (USD), and 50% S&P 500 Index (Gross) (USD). 

The Portfolio Return and underlying holdings performance numbers are calculated using Gross Fund Performance, using the Modified Dietz method of calculation, which considers the timing of cash flows during the periods. Gross fund performance reflects the effective performance of the underlying mutual funds that are selected or recommended by SIMC to implement an institutional client's investment strategy. 
