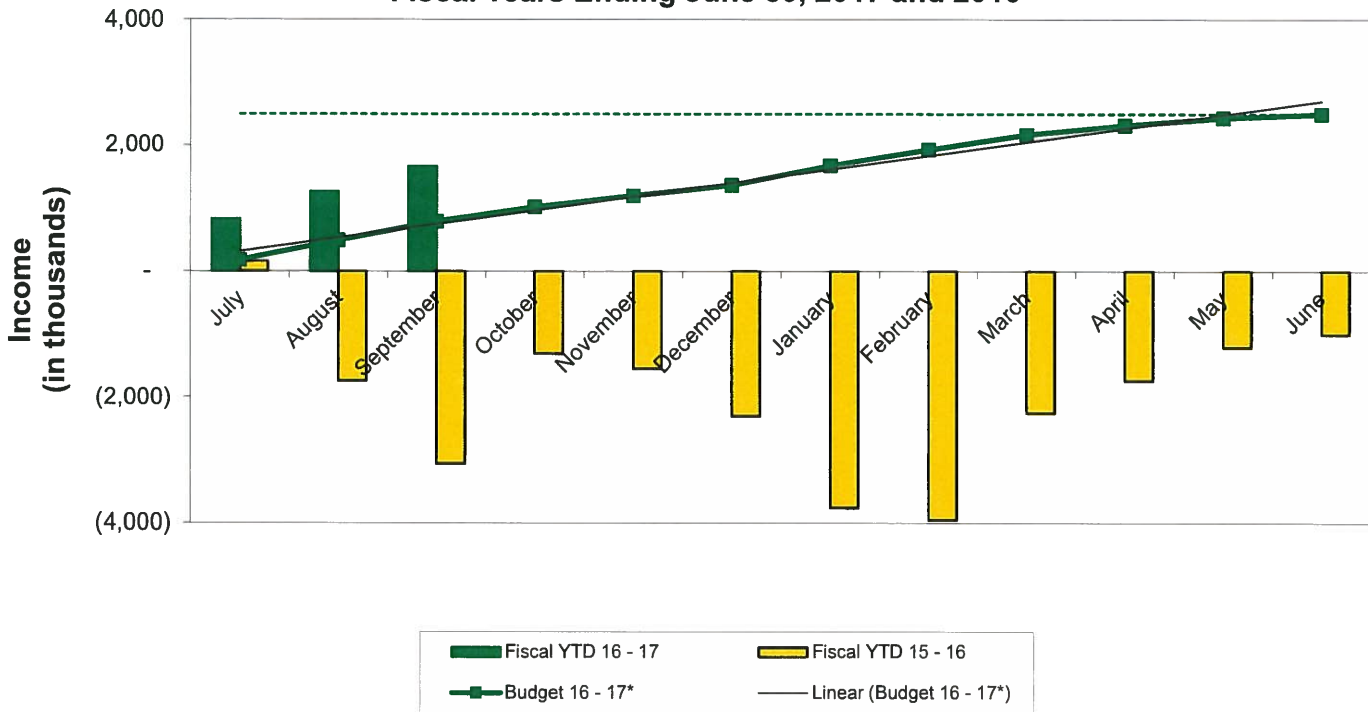

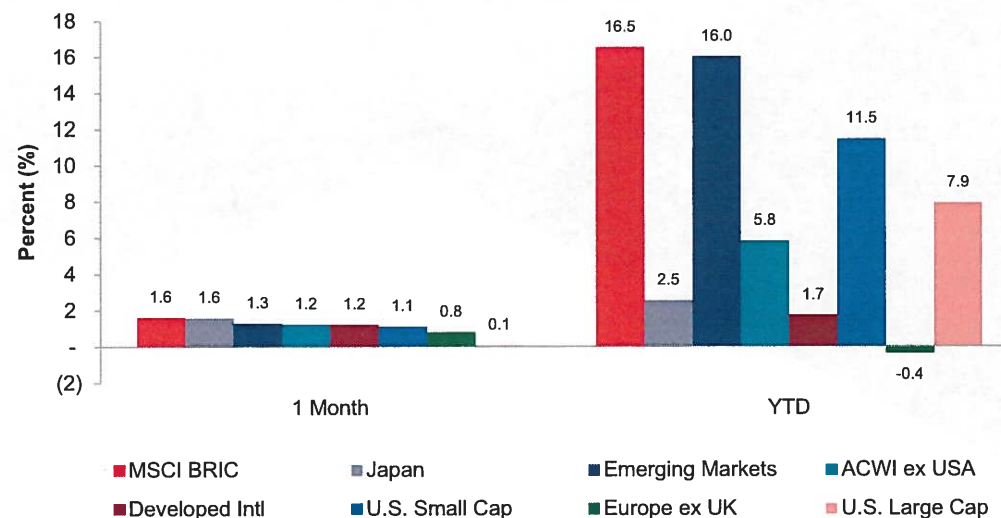

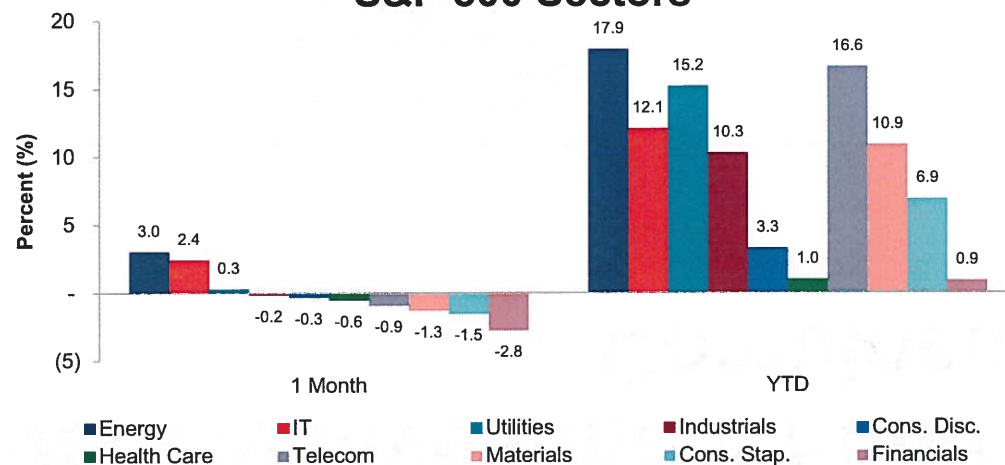
Monthly Commentary

- The third quarter began with a boost as the post-Brexit-vote recovery rally continued in force across most stock markets around the globe. The trend levelled off by mid-quarter, with the S&P 500 index hitting an all-time high on August 15, before an early September selloff. The U.S. Federal Reserve's (Fed) decision to hold back from increasing rates was well-received, as stocks recovered and moved sideways through the end of the quarter.
- During the quarter, riskier assets outperformed more defensive ones, led by emerging market and developed market equities.
- Within equity markets, this theme was reflected in the outperformance of value and growth factors over stability and momentum.
- We expect economic performance to continue improving, albeit at a slow pace, and therefore maintain a favorable view of risk-on positioning.
- With central banks implementing aggressive monetary easing, we believe any pullback in the price of riskier assets should be limited.
- Within U.S. equity strategies, we prefer value and aggressive-growth characteristics over stability.

S&P 500 Sectors

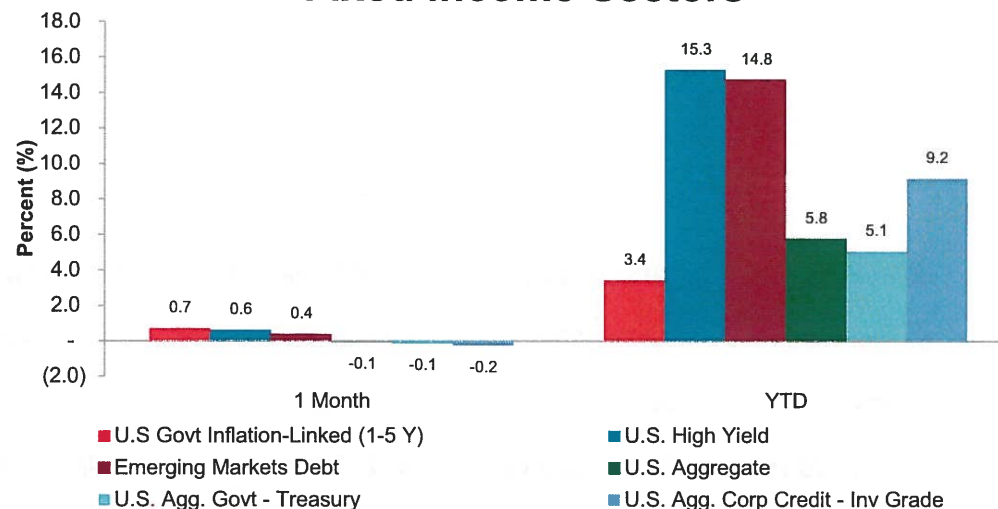

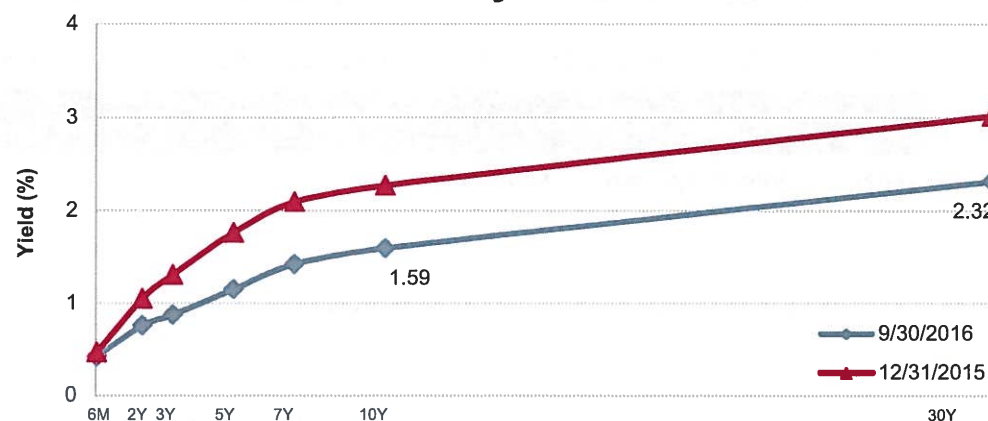
Monthly Commentary

- Global fixed-income markets were mostly flat during September, but had a strong quarter overall, led again by riskier market segments. U.S. high-yield bonds delivered the best quarterly performance, followed by emerging-market debt, with both areas remaining as top performers on the year.
- The U.S. yield curve steepened modestly over the month with shorter-term rates falling and longer-term rates rising, but has flattened meaningfully over the course of the year.
- Interest rates reached historic lows before rebounding from the Brexit-induced market panic. We expect renewed policy divergence between the Fed and other central banks, but U.S. rates are likely to move higher at a subdued pace.
- Most underlying funds were (and remain) positioned for rising rates, reflecting our view that an improving economic outlook and stronger inflation expectations should force the Fed's hand. As a result, expectations for higher short-term rates have provided a tailwind to curve-flattening trades.
- Financials are attractive, particularly within corporate credit, given strong balance sheets and the improved net interest margins that should result from higher rates and improved economic activity.

U.S. Treasury Yield Curve



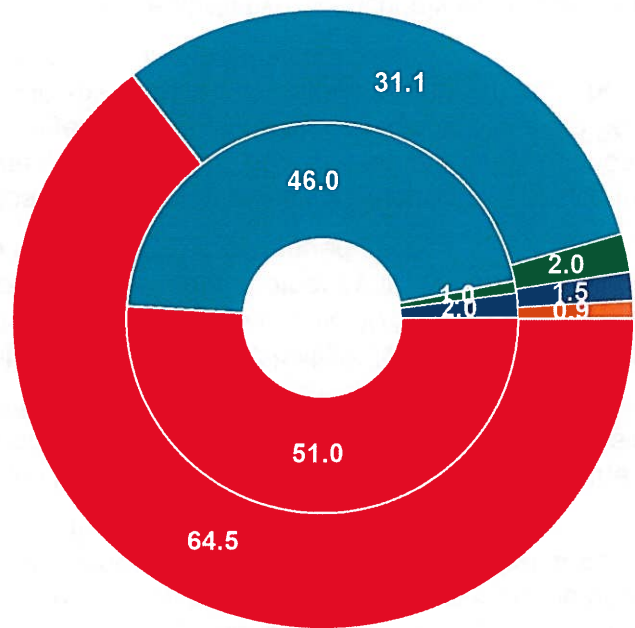

The SEI Alternative Funds, with the exception of its structured credit and energy debt products, are “fund-of-funds”, which means that the funds invest in underlying third party funds. For interim reporting, fund of fund valuations are typically estimates and may be subject to later adjustment.

The value of investments in the SEI Alternative Fund(s), including the structured credit and energy debt products, as presented in this report are calculated pursuant to each fund’s valuation procedures on either a monthly or quarterly basis as described in the Confidential Private Placement Memorandum of each fund. All of the SEI Alternative Funds undergo an annual audit. Alternative, Property and Private Assets performance is calculated gross of investment management fees and net of administrative expenses and underlying fund expenses. However: Structured Credit Fund performance is calculated gross of investment management fees and net of administrative expenses; SEI Offshore Opportunity Fund II Ltd. Class A performance is calculated net of investment management and administrative fees; and Energy Debt Fund performance is calculated net of management fees and operating expenses and is based on the July 2015 series. Clients implemented via collective investment trusts incur product-level fees, including trustee and administrative fees, which will affect performance.

The Portfolio Return and underlying holdings performance numbers are calculated using Gross Fund Performance, using the Modified Dietz method of calculation, which considers the timing of cash flows during the periods. Gross fund performance reflects the effective performance of the underlying mutual funds that are selected or recommended by SIMC to implement an institutional client's investment strategy. Gross fund performance does not reflect the impact of fund level management fees, fund administration or shareholder servicing fees, all of which, if applicable are used to offset the account level investment management fees the client pays to SIMC. Gross fund performance does reflect certain operational expenses charged by the funds and the reinvestment of dividends and other earnings.
