Also included within services are coverages for medical malpractice, cyber, and environmental insurance. This was competitively bid by our broker "Marsh USA" but is not expected to exceed \$600,000. This contract may be extended by the IUC on an annual basis by mutual agreement.

The portion for vending was approved in the June 2016 BOT meeting through June 2026.
