Rationale for CCHMC Tuition Reduction Request

CCHMC will pay full tuition for a minimum of 10 students for each cohort in the Nursing, MS in Pediatric Nurse Practitioner – Acute Care, online program beginning Fall 2018. Ten students have enrolled in the first cohort, which began Fall 2018. Each cohort will take 6 graduate credit hours per semester for 9 consecutive semesters (Fall/Spring/Summer) for a total of 54 hours.

Table 1 illustrates the prediction that CCHMC will send 10 students per cohort over the next 3 years. That results in 1080 total semester hours (see Table 2) and a total of \$712,800 in revenue, using the 2018-2019 tuition rate of \$660 per graduate hour (see Table 3). The revenue will increase each academic year as graduate tuition rates increase 2-3% each year.

CCHMC is willing to pay Ohio resident tuition rate, but not the full non-Ohio resident tuition rate for non-Ohio resident employees in this program. For Fall 2018, there are 3 students from Kentucky. We are proposing to reduce 99% of the non-Ohio resident surcharge for non-Ohio

residents. Ohio legislation requires that there must be some non-Ohio resident surcharge. A similar tuition reduction proposal was approved by ODHE in 2014 for Youngstown State University to reduce its non-Ohio resident fee for CCHMC students in its Master of Respiratory Care program.

The non-Ohio resident, graduate tuition for 2018-2019 is \$1,125 per credit hour, making the 2018-2019 non-Ohio resident surcharge is \$465. A reduction of 99% of \$465 results in an adjusted tuition of \$664.50 per credit hour. For each non-Ohio resident student, the tuition reduction equals \$460.50 per credit hour, which equals \$24,867 per non-Ohio resident, CCHMC employee who completes the 54 hour program.

Using the 2018-2019 CCHMC cohort, the tuition reduction for 3 students would total \$74,601. As illustrated in Table 3, even with this tuition reduction of \$24,687, Cohort 1 will generate a revenue of \$356,400. Additionally, CoNH is not adding any non-instructional staff, FT faculty or Adjuncts.

Tuition Waiver Recommendation for College of Nursing and Health & Cincinnati Children's Hospital Medical Center

The following resolution is presented to the committee for approval and recommendation to the Board of Trustees for appropriate action:

RESOLUTION 19-

WHEREAS, §381.170 of Am. Sub. H.B. 49 of the 132nd General Assembly requires any waiver of tuition for a particular student or any class of students not otherwise permitted by law at a state-assisted institution of higher education to be approved by the Chancellor of the Ohio Department of Higher Education; and

WHEREAS, Directive 2009-011 signed by the Chancellor of the Ohio Department of Higher Education on April 17, 2009, established procedures for institutions to follow when requesting to waive standard tuition rates; and

WHEREAS, this resolution is contingent upon the approval of the Chancellor of the Ohio Department of Education; and

WHEREAS, Wright State University is entering into a Memo of Understanding (MOU) between the Wright State University College of Nursing and Health (CONH) and Cincinnati Children's Hospital Medical Center (CCHMC) for employees of CCHMC to attend the online Nursing, MS in Pediatric Nurse Practitioner – Acute Care program; and

WHEREAS, CCHMC will pay the tuition for employees enrolled in this program for a minimum of ten (10) different employees each academic year; and

WHEREAS, some of the CCHMC employees in this program may be non-Ohio residents; and

WHEREAS, Wright State University is requesting a fee reduction of 99% of the non-Ohio resident surcharge for students who work at CCHMC who enroll in the Nursing, MS in Pediatric Nurse Practitioner – Acute Care program; and

WHEREAS, Using 2018-2019 graduate tuition rates, the Ohio resident, graduate student tuition rate is \$660 per credit hour and the non-Ohio resident, graduate student tuition rate is \$1,125 per credit hour, making the non-Ohio resident surcharge of \$465; a 99% reduction results in an adjusted tuition rate of \$665.50 per credit hour; and

WHEREAS, Wright State University is requesting the tuition reduction be approved beginning in the Spring 2019 term; and

BE IT RESOLVED that the administration of Wright State University is authorized to offer a tuition reduction of 99% of the non-Ohio resident surcharge for non-Ohio residents employed by Cincinnati Children's Hospital Medical Center accepted into the Nursing, MS in Pediatric Nurse Practitioner – Acute Care program at Wright State University beginning in the Spring 2019 term; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the administration of Wright State University will submit a request to the Chancellor of the Ohio Department of Higher Education to review and approve the tuition reduction.
