The minutes were approved as written.

III. Report of the University President or Provost

President Edwards was unable to attend the meeting. Provost Evans took questions but most items were deferred to President Edwards. A summary of the questions sent to President Edwards from Faculty President Boyd is included below. As of April 10, 2022, the Faculty Office has not received a response. This section will be amended if a response is received prior to the April meeting of the Faculty Senate. [Update 4/25: This section has been updated to include responses distributed to the Faculty Senators via email on April 22, 2022]

1. **Curriculum & Budget Office**

Why is the budget office blocking the approval of new courses after the courses have been approved through the University's curriculum approval process? Faculty have the right and responsibility to develop new curriculum, and chairs have the responsibility to determine if/when curriculum is offered. In fact, the Budget Office approval does not appear in the policies governing course development. Faculty are trying to be innovative, creative, and forward thinking by crafting new courses so that we can help recruit and retain students. Can you please explain why the budget office is questioning course development and not approving new courses, when the curriculum is the responsibility of the Faculty?

The content of the curriculum is the purview of faculty. However, the (1) department chair/program director, (2) dean of college, (3) dean of graduate school also have to approve per the process in Curriculog. There are budgetary implications of adding new courses which is why deans are involved in the decision-making process.

The final steps in Curriculog are for budget and registrar. We are aware of the need to approve courses by the end of April and at this point there are 12 courses awaiting final approval.

I have asked the deans to provide enrollment targets for these courses as that they should have taken into consideration when approving them. Please be reminded that we are required to provide low enrollment course and program data to ODHE on a periodic basis.

2. **Morale, Recruitment, and Retention**

Does the University have a recruitment and retention plan for Faculty and Staff? If not, what is being done to address morale? Faculty and Staff members have taken on a lot more responsibility due to the number of people who have left the university but have not been replaced. The same work needs to be done, but with fewer people.

Dr. Edwards will address this on Monday at our [April] Senate meeting.

3. Intel investment in Ohio universities

- a. What is WSU doing at the university level to compete for this funding?

WSU is working on the following 2 proposals, based on the responses from the white paper that was solicited by RSP to address the Intel RFP. We will participate in the collaborative efforts with UC and UD and other SOCHE partners to put an educational development proposal that focuses on curriculum development and faculty training which is led by UC. WSU will lead a research proposal that combines the elements of the white papers and the key research capabilities of WSU as it relates to the RFP and scope.

- b. Are there plans to group/partner with other institutions?

Yes, the proposal team are working on partnering with Institutions as appropriate.

- c. If more than one proposal is being developed at WSU, what are the selection rules to determine which proposal will be submitted to Intel (Intel prefers one proposal per institution)?

The proposal selection process was that a call for white paper was solicited to all faculty at WSU. Based on the responses received, all the PIs of the white paper were invited for a discussion session and item a. was developed because of the discussion and communicated to the PIs and their respective Deans. After checking with Intel we believe that we will be able to submit the educational proposal as a co-partner and the research proposal as the lead institution.

G. Motion request:

Due to the circumstances surrounding COVID-19 and the need to conduct online meetings, the Faculty Senate Executive Committee requests a motion to ratify all actions of the Faculty Senate made during online sessions from March 2020 – February 2022.

Faculty President Boyd introduced the above language and asked for a motion from the floor. Senator Bennet made the motion, and the motion was seconded.

Senator Hall raised an objection stating that this method should have been conducted via Article IV.

Faculty President Boyd replied that Senate's hands were tied at the time due to State of Ohio and University edicts not allowing in-person meetings coupled with the Faculty Constitution that required monthly meetings without an online provision. Furthermore, not everyone agrees that it is necessary. Senator Hall replied that if it is not necessary then the point is moot, otherwise it should go before the whole body [University Faculty]. Faculty President Boyd asked if any others shared the concern or had additional concerns and none were raised.

Faculty President Boyd called for a vote. The motion was approved by voice vote with one vote against the motion.

Faculty President Boyd asked for concerns or discussion, and then called for a vote. Items V.A. 1-10 were approved without dissent.

Upon approval of the item, Senator Ganapathy read the following statement from the Faculty Senate Executive Committee:

The faculty senate EC is concerned that the policy of charging differential tuition for GAs based upon residency status. This policy, combined with the requirement that GA tuition remission is accounted for in department and program budgets, means that graduate programs are limited in their ability to recruit and retain the best qualified graduate students, some of whom may be non-residents. This is unfortunate since attracting top talent to WSU graduate programs benefits the university and ultimately the broader community, given that graduate students who come from outside of Ohio may remain in Ohio following graduation and provide unique contributions to the Ohio workforce. For these reasons, the senate EC encourages the Graduate Academic Policy Committee and administration to make additional modifications to Policy 5120 – Graduate Assistants so that this policy will dictate and clarify that GAs are charged at the residency tuition rates.
