

"How to Die for Rus": The Afterlives of Prince Peter Bagration between Russian Empire and Nation

Professor Pollock's current research focuses on the history and memory of the Russian campaign of 1812, which Russians have ever since called the Patriotic War. Specifically, he is interested in the ways that individuals and institutions have used memories of Prince Petr Ivanovich Bagration (pronounced ba-gra-ti-ON), a Russian general who died from complications related to wounds received during the battle of Borodino, to advance claims about Russian empire and nation between 1812 and 2012.
