II. Old Business

- Minutes

IV. Open Commentary

- Question on healthcare insurance. Is there something that can be done to embed our deductible and out of pocket to compensate for the lack of raises? Carly Porter serves on the healthcare committee and will communicate this with them along with expressing our concerns. Note that the committee has no say but is an advisory committee. The school is dealing with the issue of shrinking enrollment and an aging workforce. While we may have less faculty/staff, our usage of insurance is increasing. The Employee Hardship fund is available to help on an emergency basis. We are self-insured and currently not looking at changing.
- Parking for Fall. Senate has reached out to Kurt Holden but has not received an answer yet on parking changes for Fall. The University leadership is aware of staff issues with parking such as a possible of different rates for remote, etc.
