


BG Paul G. Craft

4th Chief of Cyber





Brigadier General Paul G. Craft, a native of Piqua, Ohio, entered the Army in 1993, as a Second Lieutenant in the Signal Corps. Brigadier General Craft currently serves as the Army's 4th Chief of Cyber and Commandant of the U.S. Army Cyber School headquartered in Fort Gordon, Georgia.

As the Commandant, he leads a team of Soldiers, Civilians, and Contractors that acquire America's most talented and innovative Citizens and develop them into Cyber and Electromagnetic Warfare warfighters. The Cyber School operates 2 colleges with 34 total courses, graduating 3,500 Joint Service Members per year, and has 800 students resident on average year-round.

Brigadier General Craft has served in key leadership and staff positions from platoon leader, company commander, battalion and brigade commander. At Echelon Corps and Below level, he served multiple tours in armistice operations in the Republic of Korea; peace-keeping operations in Haiti with the 10th Mountain Division; multiple combat operations in Afghanistan with the



82nd Airborne Division and the British Army; and humanitarian operations supporting the Department of Homeland Security for the recent resettlement of Afghan Refugees. At the operational and strategic level, BG Craft has served at 3rd Military Intelligence Battalion (INSCOM), U.S. Army Signal Center of Excellence (TRADOC), U.S. Army Human Resources Command (HRC), Network Engineering and Technology Command (NETCOM), Department of the Army Chief Information Officer / G-6 (DA CIO/G-6), Defense Information Systems Agency (DISA), and Joint Force Headquarters – Department of Defense Information Network / U.S. Cyber Command (JFHQ-DODIN/USCYBERCOM).

Brigadier General Craft has a Bachelor of Science in American Political Science with a concentration in Systems Engineering from the U.S. Military Academy, West Point, New York. He also earned three masters degrees; a Master of Science in Information Management and a Master of Business Administration (dual degree) from Arizona State University as part of the Army's Advanced Civil Schooling program and a Master of Science in National Security and Resource Strategy with a concentration in Cyber from the Eisenhower School, National Defense University.

His awards and decorations are commensurate with his time in service.

He has been married for 28 years and has one daughter.
