





COVID 19 Cases

- EHS report Zero Active cases
- Ohio 68% decline



All dates are based when an indicator is reported and will not match data in other COVID-19 dashboards provided by the Ohio Department of Health. All other dashboards are based on onset date, date of hospitalization, or date of death.

Mortality data is verified by coded death certificate information received from the National Center for Health Statistics, and can take some time to receive. This information is not available daily, and is updated approximately twice per week as data is received.

**Starting 03/02/2021, the CÓVID-19 death data will be reported from the Electronic Deaths Registration System. The "Last 24 Hour Reported Change", "21 Day Reported Average" and "21 Day Trend" metrics will initially be incomplete but will continue to be updated.
