Faculty Constitution Meeting

On Monday, March 27, the Faculty Senate approved a small update to the <u>Faculty Constitution</u> to reflect the current <u>University Mission Statement</u>. A meeting will be held at <u>2:30pm</u>, <u>Monday</u>, <u>April 3</u> in 160 Rike for University Faculty members to discuss the proposed changes. All faculty members will then have the opportunity to vote to approve the changes from May 1-3; at least 100 faculty members must vote to reach a quorum.
